3. Identified Tasks

- Cleaning and maintenance of garden areas
- Segregation of waste into biodegradable and non-biodegradable categories
- Pruning of shrubs and basic plant maintenance
- Cleaning near parking areas, playgrounds, and common utility spaces
- Awareness among students about campus hygiene and waste disposal



4. Activity Implementation (18th–22nd November 2025)

Under the guidance of coordinators, all faculty members and students cleaned their respective departments. The collective effort brought noticeable improvement across all academic blocks. The NSS unit played a crucial role by managing the cleaning of outdoor and common areas.

- Daily cleaning sessions conducted for 1–2 hours

7. Conclusion


